- 7. What do the following verses have to say about our sins?

- 8. According to v.4, what happens as a result of being buried with him?
- 9. What bearing does our union with Christ have on the question Paul is addressing in verse 1?
- 10. In verse four is there any significance in the word "walk"?

  - 11. Why do so few Christians seem to have grasped and acted on the freedom from sin's enslavement that Paul teaches in this passage (6:1-11)?

- 12. Take some time to reflect on the image of burial. What happens when something is buried?
- 13. "God takes our sins the past, present, and future, and dumps them in the sea and puts up a sign that says NO FISHING ALLOWED." -Corrie Ten Boom.
  - a. What do you think about this quote?
  - b. Who or under what circumstances has this sign been trespassed?
  - c. Are you sometimes tempted to 'go fishing'?
- 14. Which verses from question 4 do you need to claim when old or present sins come back to haunt you?
- 15. Is it just a "mind game" to think, "I'm dead to sin" when you feel very much alive to it? What real difference does this make?
- 16. What specific aspect of the old life do you need to cast off so that you can now walk in newness of life?
