Over time, we all tend to wander off track ... so a fresh start can be really helpful. It helps us re-focus, recalibrate, and move forward rejuvenated.

As we follow Jesus into this New Year,
we would be wise to start out right in a few key areas ...

Loving Jesus

- 1. God's Word: Read through half the OT in 2015.
- 2. Spirit-Led Living: Ask Him to fill you each day.
- 3. Prayer: Pray and fast each Wednesday.
- 4. Worship: Come prepared each Sunday.
- 5. Stewardship: Trust Him and give as He directs.

Growing Together

- 1. Plug into a Growth Group.
- 2. Prepare for servant-leadership roles.

Serving Our World

- 1. Slow Pitches: Ask the Lord for some each month.
- 2. Local Outreach: Make it part of your experience.
- 3. Missions: Understand your role in getting it done.

By now you have discovered that all roads do not lead to God, and life is not as simple as you once thought. For those who are at this crossroad, the Bible offers a new direction, one filled with purpose, fulfillment, and acceptance. The steps are simple:

Recognize that you're a sinner.

You must admit your spiritual need. "There is none righteous, no, not one." (Romans 3:10). We can't make excuses or blame others for our actions. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23).

Recognize that Jesus Christ died on the cross for you.

"For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God..." (1 Peter 3:18). Jesus paid the price for your sin. The apostle Paul said, "...the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." (Galatians 2:20).

Repent of your sins.

The word "repent" means "to change your direction." The Bible tells us, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." (Acts 3:19). God commands us to repent. You must be willing to turn away from the things that displease God.

Accept Jesus as your Savior.

Jesus said, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28). It is essential to come to Jesus just as you are. Don't try to "clean up your life" before you come to God. Instead, receive Him and allow Him to do the "cleansing." Jesus said, "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, And the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out." (John 6:37).
