In the third commandment defends the honor of God's great Name.

Unlike the first two commandments, He speaks it in the third person.

He does this to call attention to His special covenant Name -
"Yahweh" in Hebrew, meaning "Lord" (see Exodus 3:14-15).

Ask yourself: "Am I keeping the Second Commandment?"

Third Commandment is both Negative and Positive:

- Negative We are not to misuse His Name in vain or worthless way.
 Deuteronomy 18:10-12a; Jeremiah 14:14a-15a; Leviticus 19:12, 24:11-16
- Positive We must honor His Name in worship and praise.
 Matthew 6:9a; Psalm 29:2, 66:2, 72:19, 103:1; Genesis 4:26; Deuteronomy 18:19, 28:58;
 Isaiah 50:10; Colossians 3:17

Case Study - Seven Sons of Sceva

Acts 19:13-20

They misused the Lord's Name and lived to regret it.

The Lord alone has sovereign authority.

How do we dishonor His Name?

- Use it as a swear word.
- Use it to advance our own agenda.
- Use it carelessly in worship.

What we do with God's Name will determine what God does with us!
